The Alpha and Omega Window

¹² "Look, I am coming soon, bringing my reward with me to repay all people according to their deeds. ¹³ I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End" (Rev. 10:12-13 NLT).



The Alpha (A) and the Omega (Ω) are the first and last letters of the Greek language of the New Testament alphabet. In Revelation, Jesus says He is the first and the

last, the beginning, and the end. They remind us that God had the first word at creation, and will have the last word at the judgment at the end of time.

Read: Revelation 22:12-17.
Reflect: What does it mean to

you that God has the first and last word?

<u>Pray</u>: Give thanks to God for being present throughout history and going before you into the future.

Pastor's Thoughts



As we have finished our April Easter season, we are left with the insight that without the resurrection, the presence of suffering in our world just cannot be explained. I know that you and I have wrestled with this problem many times in our lives. How can our loving God place us in a world where there is so much suffering?

Consider just one aspect - of our aging. That which is physical, gradually degenerates away. Our flesh ages, our energy declines, and our bodies are not naturally capable of earlier feats.

I can only accept one real explanation. It is because the only way we grow spiritually is by struggling with pain and by experiencing that this world truly cannot satisfy us. A person who never confronts pain and suffering will forever remain a spiritual infant with the illusion that happiness can be discovered in this life. The only way I can accept some of the profound tragedies I see in this world, is to believe that this world is a merely preparatory school for a better world yet to come.

Without the resurrection, it is simply difficult to explain a world in which people suffer. But, the resurrection is real.

Jesus was seen by over 500 witnesses in His resurrected body! There is a better world to come! That's a fact!

Christ is alive. Christ rose from the dead. He is alive, and He is available in our world today for a personal relationship. He is our Good Shepherd that knows us by name. Christ is preparing us for a future perfect home in heaven. Amen!

Reasons Why We Believe in the Resurrection

(1) Jesus himself testified to his Resurrection from the dead (Mark 8:31; Matthew 17:22; Luke 9:22).



(2) The tomb was empty on Easter Sunday (Luke Although 24:3). the guards claimed (Matthew 28:13), that the disciples of Jesus had stolen the body, every sensible Jew knew that it was impossible for the terrified disciples of Jesus to steal the body of Jesus from a tomb guarded by an armed, 16-member Temple Guard detachment.

- (3) The initial disbelief of Jesus' own disciples in His Resurrection, in spite of His repeated apparitions, serves as a strong proof of His Resurrection. Their initial disbelief explains why the Apostles started preaching the Risen Christ only after receiving the anointing of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost.
- (4) The transformation of Jesus' disciples transformed men who were hopeless and fearful after the crucifixion (*Luke 24:21, John 20:19*), into men who now were confident and bold witnesses to the Resurrection (*Acts 2:24, 3:15, 4:2*).
- (5) Neither the Jews and the Romans could disprove Jesus' Resurrection by presenting the dead body of Jesus.
- (6) The Apostles and early Christians would not have faced martyrdom if they were not absolutely sure of Jesus' Resurrection.
- (7) The Apostle Paul's conversion from a persecutor of Christians to a zealous preacher of of Jesus supports the

truth of Jesus' Resurrection (<u>Galatians</u> <u>1:11-17</u>, <u>Acts 9:1</u>, <u>Acts 9:24-25</u>, <u>Acts</u> <u>26:15-18</u>).

(8) The sheer existence of a thriving, empire-conquering early Christian Church, bravely facing and surviving three centuries of persecution, supports the truth of the Resurrection claim.

(9) The New Testament witnesses do not bear the stamp of dupes or deceivers. The Apostles and the early Christians were absolutely sure about the Resurrection of Jesus.

New Testament scholar N.T. Wright has commented that the clearest indication for a first-century Jew, that someone was not the Messiah, would be his death at the hands of the enemies of Israel. That the Church of Christ endured as a Messianic religion is possible only on the assumption that the Crucified One was alive.

Session discussed the Presbytery correspondence we received that informed us of the denominational change to our Constitution that allows same sex marriage in churches that decide to allow it and for pastors willing to preside over the weddings. With the change, both churches and pastors have the current right to refuse to conduct the ceremonies; some feel that the right to refuse will only be for a limited time citing past denominational changing stances. Same sex marriages are currently illegal in Ohio. Ohio has an appeal before the U.S. Supreme Court awaiting decision. Some PCUSA churches are seeking to leave the denomination over this issue for other Presbyterian denominations.

The Presbytery Meeting is May 19, 2015; Charlie Good will accompany Rev. Thomas Emery to this meeting.
