**ACTION POINT**

The founding fathers believed the phrase, “In God we trust.” Our founders knew that because of God’s grace, we have a greater freedom than any constitution can grant us. There is a word for freedom in the N.T. It is the word, "redemption." "Redemption" means "to be set free." It means that we have been bought with a price, that we are freed of our bondage. The Gospel is a message of liberty. It is a liberating message for the poor; it is freedom for the prisoners; it is sight for the blind and it is release for the oppressed. I love the words of Jesus recorded in the 8th chapter of John. “So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed.” Are you free? You can be; because if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed!!! Let us choose today to serve God, not this world.
