Salem Church History

Annual reports of our church started in 1896 (shown) and have long been available on the web at www.venedocia.org. You can learn a lot of history from these reports, including membership lists and finances. The early ones are entirely in Welsh and are joint reports with the former Zion Church near Jonestown.



In the years 1896 – 1898, Pastor Edward Roberts served Salem Church as well as Zion Church in Jonestown. His annual salary from Salem was \$900.00 and the total regular collection averaged around \$1,740.00, with nearly 300 congregational members listed in the books.



The present church building was dedicated in the year 1898. The total cost of the building was almost \$20,000.00 at the time. The photo included here is found in the report as a photo from the dedication day, however it does differ from other sources.

Venedocia Sunset

Dr. Henry Norris Russell, famed Princeton University astronomer, once gave a lecture in which he talked of the Milky Way and its millions of stars. He told how many of them are far larger than our sun and how the still more distant heavens swarm with uncountable stars. When he finished his address a troubled woman came to him and asked a question. "Dr. Russell, if our world is so little, and the universe is so great, can we believe that God pays any attention to us human beings?"

The noted astronomer answered, "That all depends, Madam, on how big a God you believe in." Dr. Norris knew about the kind of faith that gives confidence.

We often think of God as at a distance. That frame of mind allows us not to be very committed to God as if God is too busy elsewhere.

On the other hand, if we realize that we have a big all-powerful God who knows everything, we will know that He is intimately involved in our lives. We would often pray to Him and ask His opinion on choices we make during the day, because He is really in charge.

I ask you, to please consider that our God is so big that he knows about every detail of your own life. As Jesus says in Matthew 10:29-31 "not a single sparrow can fall to the ground without your Father knowing it. ³⁰ And the very hairs on your head are all numbered. ³¹ So don't be afraid; you are more valuable to God than a whole flock of sparrows."

Know now and have full confidence that our big God is not far away, and He is seeking you for a close relationship!

Understanding Forgiveness

When we begin our Sunday morning service, we focus on forgiving others as we have been forgiven by reciting a prayer of confession and taking time to silently reflect on our hearts before God.

Jesus said this, "So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift." (Matthew 5:23-24, ESV) He also said, "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother." (Matthew 18:15, ESV)

Forgiveness must always be the rule between two followers of Jesus Christ. Both the offended party and the offending party have a biblical responsibility to heal the relationship and to restore what has been ruptured. It is one thing to know that you want to forgive, but it is an entirely different thing to get to the point where you do forgive.

The secret in how to do just that is found in Ephesians 5. Here we learn why (the motivation) we ought to forgive and how (the method) we ought to forgive. I will warn you that these steps may seem simple, but the steps are difficult to follow through. Just remember: "I choose to forgive others just as God has forgiven me."

1. Get Rid of All Bitterness: "Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice." (Ephesians 4:31, ESV) You cannot bear the fruit of forgiveness until you cut out the root of bitterness. "Put away" literally means to "remove" or "to separate yourself from something."

Have you ever walked into a spider web? If you have, you know what the term "arachnophobia" means. What is the first thing you immediately do? With urgency, you immediatly begin to pull at anything and everything that feels like a spider web, and you won't



stop until it is all gone. That is the idea in this verse!

The word bitterness originally meant something that was sharp or pointed. Bitterness is like a sword that you carry in a sheaf beside you that you would like to use to thrust through someone's heart. You never leave home unarmed, because you just might meet up with that person that you are bitter toward. Paul's advice is simple: If you have any bitter feelings toward somebody – get rid of them. Are you still mad at someone because of what they did to you? Put it away!

You may be thinking to yourself, "Well, that is easy for Paul to say." But it really wasn't for him, because when Paul wrote these words he was sitting in a crude underground Roman cell unjustly incarcerated, unfairly treated, and eventually he would lose his life for telling the truth. Yet, you could find no bitterness or unresolved anger in his heart.

Well, you say, "Paul is just a lot more spiritual than I am." It is not just a matter of being spiritual; it is a matter of being smart. What do I mean by that? Bitterness is like an acid that eats its own container. It is a cancer that destroys its own body. Somebody once said, bitterness is like drinking poison and then waiting for the other person to die.

Your bitterness has absolutely no effect on the person you are bitter toward. When you are bitter towards someone, you are thinking about that someone, but that someone is not thinking about you. Does your bitterness ever keep you up at night? They are probably sleeping like a baby. Does your bitterness ever give you indigestion? They are eating like a pig. The problem with bitterness is it grows, it controls and it consumes.

The secret to letting go of our bitterness is found in two words in the next verse. "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." (Ephesians 4:32, NIV) The two most important words in this passage we read are those

words, "just as." That is the motivation for forgiveness. Jesus is our model for forgiveness and that is the method for forgiveness. I *choose* to forgive others just as God has forgiven me.

2. We Are to Live Forgiveness: Notice the first thing Paul says. "Be kind to one another" (Ephesians

4:32, ESV). For every negative, there is a positive. For every action, there is a reaction. It is amazing that when you eliminate bitterness, you activate kindness. Have you ever met a kind *and* bitter person? Probably not.

The next thing Paul says is, "Be...tenderhearted" (Ephesians 4:32, ESV). Bitterness hardens the heart. Kindness and forgiveness softens the heart. Forgiveness can only flow from a kinder, gentler heart. Then Paul hits us with the punch line. "Forgiving each another, just as in Christ God forgave you" (Ephesians 4:32, NIV). It is a simply profound statement and a profoundly simple statement. The basic reason why you ought to be a forgiving person is because you are a forgiven person.

Only forgiven people are truly motivated to forgive. You forgive, because you are forgiven. You are forgiven, because Jesus Christ died and was raised from the dead so you could be forgiven. You will never be able to forgive someone else until you remember how God has forgiven you for what you have done to Him. You will never forgive anyone if you always focus on the one who has hurt you. You will only forgive the one who has hurt you if you choose to focus on the one who died for you, because you hurt him. And that is the motivation of forgiveness. But what is the method?

God forgives us freely. Jesus Christ didn't charge us anything when He died for us. He didn't extract a pound of flesh. He didn't take His revenge first. He didn't say, "Pay me what you owe me." He didn't say, "Clean up your life and get it together and then I'll die for you." He died for us so that we could be forgiven freely.

The way He forgives us is the way we are to forgive others – freely with no strings attached, no fine print at the bottom of the contract and no conditions. God forgives us fully because forgiveness is not partial. Do you understand that if God refused to forgive one part

of one fraction, of one decimal point, of one sin, none of us could ever be forgiven and have eternal life? God not only forgives all of our sins (plural), but he forgives all of our sin (singular).

Someone reading this article may be diagnosed with a medical condition. If your doctor looks at you and tells

you that you have say, a cancerous tumor in your body, you won't ask him what put it there, you won't ask him if you can live with it, or even ask who is to blame that you have it. The question you are going to ask is, "Can you get it out?" Suppose you find out, for that cancer to be removed, the entire tumor to be taken out, it is going to cost you everything you have. Do you think you would go back to that doctor and say, "What would you charge for just half a tumor?" No, because it doesn't matter what it will cost you. You'll want it all out!

God expects the same thing of us. When we forgive, He wants *all* of that sin forgiven, and He wants *all* of that bitterness removed. When we forgive, forgive fully. God forgives us completely. God keeps no records of past wrongs. When God cancels the debt He burns the note, and that is exactly what God expects of us. When we forgive, let it be final.


