

“Faith Enough” Mark 10:46-52

If they looked at Bartimaeus, they saw only a blind beggar. They probably thought that here is someone who ought to know his place. When they heard Bartimaeus, loud above even the excited crowd that followed Jesus, they heard only noise. He was an embarrassing interruption, an irritation, to be shut down quickly so that his betters could hear. The crowd listened to and walked with Jesus, but the crowd did not seem to think Jesus could, or should, be interested in Bartimaeus. Perhaps, the crowd thought that Jesus should be as blind to his cries as they were.

TEACHING POINTS

Teaching Point One: *Faith enough to seek Christ.*

Teaching Point Two: *Faith enough to believe that Jesus would heal.*

Teaching Point Three: *Faith enough to follow Jesus.* Bartimaeus immediately chose to follow Jesus rather than returning to a normal life.

THIS WEEK'S MEMORY VERSE

⁵² *“And Jesus said to him, ‘Go, for your faith has healed you.’ Instantly the man could see, and he followed Jesus down the road.”* (Mark 10:52 NLT)

ACTION POINT

For all of us, as for Bartimaeus, our Lord listens. He commands us to come near to Him, and Jesus exalts even the lowliest. “What do you want me to do for you?” Jesus asks Bartimaeus. Jesus heals the deepest needs and hurts of our souls, making us fit to follow Him on His way of unconditional love: “Go; your faith has made you well.”

Will the real blind beggars among us please stand up? That is me -- and you. As fellow beggars, let's go to Him to be healed of our spiritual blindness. Take heart; He's calling for us to be healed.
