“Be Prepared Always” Mark 13:1-8
Salem Presbyterian Church
November 15, 2015

Mark 13 is part of the end-times Biblical literature. The list of calamities would have been a familiar one to Mark's hearers. But, what in this world passes away? Transitory things will pass away, those fleeting things of earth. God and God's purposes are eternal. God's people are anchored in the everlasting. Therefore, we live in and for those qualities which endure. The future promise of Christ's return shapes our current living, because it fills "each moment" with the possibility of being the moment in which we see the glory of God.

TEACHING POINTS

POINT ONE - *It's the end of the world as we know it, and I feel fine.*

POINT TWO – *Delay gives us time to prepare.*

POINT THREE – *You don't have to wait for the end of time to enter God's Kingdom.*

THIS WEEK'S MEMORY VERSE

And you will hear of wars and threats of wars, but don't panic. Yes, these things must take place, but the end won't follow immediately (Mark 13:7 NLT).

ACTION POINT

God's power is never so available as when we are reduced to the extremity of despair. We are never told that difficult times will pass us by; rather, we are told difficulties will be temporary. Or, if they do not go away, grace will be given to cope with them. Paul's thorn in the flesh was never removed. "Three times I besought the Lord about this, that it should leave me; but he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness'" (2 Corinthians 12:8-9). What does it all mean? It is the Christian view of history. Ultimately, God will triumph. No matter what overtakes the earth, God is God. Disciples are to be watching, on the lookout, for the Son of Man whose arrival is certain even if His timing is unknown. We can keep our watch, being ready for whatever opportunities come for service in His Name.
