“Less of Me, More of Him” Luke 3:2-14

John the Baptist was accused by the Jewish leaders of his day of tearing down the establishment teachings of the religious leaders. John shifted the chief requirements from legalistic observances to moral duties. He required his followers to repent of their sins and do deeds of love and mercy to the poor. He declared that the evidence of right relations with God would be the act of sharing extra possessions with the needy and bread with the hungry. “If you have two shirts, give one to the poor. If you have food, share it with those who are hungry.” Do we have extra possessions that others need? Do we see the hungry around us? John’s change of spiritual values gained the fatal hatred of those in high places.

TEACHING POINTS

POINT ONE – *John’s message was to prepare yourself, because soon the Messiah is coming.* That was the heart of his message. One is coming after John who was before John. One is coming who is superior to John.

POINT TWO – *Prepare the way by repenting.* We need to look at our own behavior.

POINT THREE – *When you have truly repented and become baptized, you are ready for the Messiah.* God entered the manger of Bethlehem in order to save God’s people from their sins. When we receive that love, that grace, and that peace, we are empowered to live new lives.

THIS WEEK’S MEMORY VERSE

¹⁶ *John answered their questions by saying, “I baptize you with water; but someone is coming soon who is greater than I am—so much greater that I’m not even worthy to be his slave and untie the straps of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire...” (Luke 3:16 NLT).*

ACTION POINT

John called for "fruits," - deeds and actions in our daily life that show we have repented. Examine your own sharing; it is a chief sign of being in right relations with God and in right relations with your brother. "He who has two coats, let him share with him who has none; and he who has food, let him do likewise" (Luke 3:11). This shows the kind of character God wants in His followers and what the true requirements of obedience are. Are you showing fruits that show you have truly repented; are you sharing with others or holding tight to all you own?
