“Favored By God” Luke 1:39-45

Being “favored by God” doesn’t make life easier. In the very midst of the harsh reality that Elizabeth and Mary lived, they continued to believe and hope in a God who can do awe-inspiring things. They did this in a world not much different from ours. They were favored by God, and God individually came to them, not because they were somehow protected from tough reality. But precisely because in the midst of their cruel reality, they continued to be open to the call of God on their lives.

TEACHING POINTS

POINT ONE – *God transforms the mundane into the meaningful.* God will use you as you are if you are willing to submit to Him. You don’t need to be unusually strong or bright or well-to-do, to be His servants.

POINT TWO – *God is reaching out to each of us, and He comes to us as Love.*

POINT THREE – *If Mary’s significance comes from her being a person in and through whom God worked his purpose and will, there is nothing that prevents us from being included with her.*

THIS WEEK’S MEMORY VERSE

My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant (Luke 1:46-48 NLT).

ACTION POINT

It was faith that enabled them to experience the favor of God and to do the things that they did with God. Above the noise of Roman armies and in a strife-torn homeland, these two women heard the silent voice of God. While others went about their daily routines, they saw the choirs of angels of heaven singing. By faith, they saw, they heard, they believed. And through Mary, Christ came into the world. Likewise, Christians are not immune to life’s hardships. But God teaches us how to live in our harsh reality. He can teach you faith, and He can likewise favor you and do great things with you.
