"Put On The New" Colossians 3:1-17
Salem Presbyterian Church

The early church had a new perspective on life. Once their fear of death and judgment was overcome, they lived differently than before. Think of the stories you have heard about people who have had near death experiences. Once they experienced that which they had feared, once they discovered for themselves that what the Church has preached for 2,000 years was true, once they had experienced firsthand the love and acceptance of the Creator, they came back to this life with new priorities. They lived the values of Christ: the love of God, a generous attitude toward one's neighbor, the nature of honesty, self-control and patience. Their lives were lived not in seeking pleasure, but in seeking to serve others. They had new principles: "Since, then, we have been raised with Christ, [let us] set [our] hearts on things above."

TEACHING POINTS

POINT ONE – *Put off the old self.* We should live for Christ and not our earthly desires.

POINT TWO – *Paul says we have to put on the new.* "Putting on," then, has to do with a deep and transforming inner experience which reflects itself outwardly.

POINT THREE – *Put on Christ.* When Paul says, "Put on Christ," he is saying that we should live life as though Christ were living through us.

THIS WEEK'S MEMORY VERSE

¹³ Make allowance for each other's faults, and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others. (*Colossians 3:13 NLT*).

ACTION POINT

Living for Christ is a personal experience, a source of power to be used in rising to a rich new life. "You have been raised with Christ." You have a hidden inner spring of energy, for "your life is hid with Christ in God." The same almighty God who raised Christ from the dead, works in and through you. That's the way, it will be with us. When we put to death the old, and put on the new -- persons who have never taken a second look at Jesus may decide to do so, because they see Jesus in us.
