Pastor's Thoughts

"And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him." (Romans 12:1 NLT)



What does it mean to become an "N" Christian? A painted "N" on your home in the Islamic countries means giving up your home, possessions, security, family members, and possibly your life for your Christian faith. It means standing courageous with Jesus Christ and being His witness whatever the cost including beheading, crucifixion, torture, rape, and sold into the sex trade.



N', or $\dot{\cup}$ in Arabic, is the symbol used by the Islamic State (IS or ISIS) to identify who is a Nazarene - a Christian.

This Easter Season, as we prayerfully conduct our observance of Lent, the sacrifice of Jesus for us tells us of choosing between living for this fading world or living for God. Lent is a time of looking inward to become more holy in our faith giving all of our self to God. It's a time to put everything on the line for God. The Bible gives us instruction.

In the Old Testament, Abraham well over the age of one hundred was called by God in Genesis 22:2 (NLT): "Take your son, your only son—yes, Isaac, whom you love so much—and go to the land of Moriah. Go and sacrifice him as a burnt offering." Isaac was Abraham's cherished son. Abraham did not have to comply, but he was obedient to his God. God offered a substitute goat at the last moment.

It is interesting that Isaac was said to be about the same age as Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane. There, Jesus as the only Son of God was offered for our sins that Good Friday and His obedience redeemed us from the evil one.

But sacrifice was to continue. A few years later, all but John of the Disciples were martyred holding firm for their faith. John wrote, "And this world is fading away, along with everything that people crave. But anyone

who does what pleases God will live forever" (1 John 2:17, NLT).

We can see our lives as a test, even while our lives are not threatened for the Gospel. Those who overcome, have the joy of the Lord vs. the hurts of this world.

Gregory the Great, in 600 A.D., said there are seven deadly sins from which all our spiritual struggles stem:

ENVY is my displeasure at the good of another. It is not rejoicing with those who rejoice.

GREED is the need to get, to have, to hold for yourself money, power, prestige, and advantages.

GLUTTONY is addictions to eating and drinking, and appetites that go unrestrained.

ANGER is the sum of rage, resentment, bitterness where your thoughts are about getting even instead of getting over. We seek to hurt and ruin others.

SLOTH is apathy and hopelessness with an: "*I don't care*" attitude about life.

Lust is love distorted by objectifying people sexually instead of seeing them as your Christian brother or sister.

PRIDE is superiority. It is considering ourselves better than others instead as another broken humble sinner before God.

Paul says, "The temptations in your life are no different from what others experience" (I Corinthians 10:13, NLT). We all have the same spiritual struggles, but some choose to live for this world while others resolve to lay all at the foot of the cross.

A Nigerian Christian was quoted: "I once thought that if I should be captured by Boko Haram Islamic fighters, I will never deny my faith in Christ Jesus... So when I met them, my mind was made up beforehand since I know who I serve."

Are you willing to pay whatever price is necessary to identify with Jesus? Christ calls us to step out to be His salt and light in a hurting world needing to know Jesus. You are Christ's ambassador to this world; the world



looks at you to see if there is something real about "this Christianity." Have you put everything on the line?

This Lent celebration, are you willing to look inward and give up the vices and bad habits that hurt your witness of Christ? Are you willing to put everything on the line to be an "N" Christian?

Franklin Graham: Calling the Nation to Repentance



"I believe we are perilously close to the moral tipping point for the survival of the United States of America.

"Founded by separatists from Europe seeking religious freedom to practice their faith before Almighty God, America has long enjoyed the blessings of a people who acknowledged and practiced belief in the God of the Bible. For centuries, our country has stood brightly as a 'city upon a hill,' defending freedom abroad, and affirming our spiritual heritage as one nation under God.

"In recent decades, however, that enduring foundation and heritage have been under relentless and vicious assault. Christians now find themselves constantly on the defensive from a progressive, godless culture that seeks to diminish and eradicate any religious influence in our society. "There now exists deep-seated antagonism and hostility toward Christianity in every seat of power in this nation—government, media, courts and education. It has become open season on Christians. Sin is openly celebrated and flaunted by the highest office in our land, and men and women of deep and sincere faith are publicly scorned.

"I refuse to bow or bend. I refuse to be silent and watch the future of our children and grandchildren be offered

up on pagan altars of personal pleasure and immorality. In the words of the Prophet Daniel as he foretold of dark and oppressive days to come for Israel, 'the people who know their God shall stand firm and take action' (Daniel 11:32).

"If our nation is to ever again lead with moral integrity and return to the faith of our fathers, we must repent of sin and humble ourselves before Him.

"First and foremost, I want people to pray for our land and our leaders. Prayer calls on omnipotent, omniscient God to accomplish His sovereign will.

"On many occasions, the nation of Israel cried out to the Lord for deliverance and relief from their adversaries, and God answered their plea. He was, and is, sovereign over every political and military empire that has ever existed, or ever will exist.

"Second, I want to encourage God's people to go to the polls, not just to elect our president but also for local and state elections. In the 2012 elections, it is estimated that 17 million evangelical Christians did not vote. That would have been more than enough to tip an election that was decided by 5 million votes.

"Cast your ballot for those who stand boldly on the side of biblical truth.

"Third, engage in the civic process wherever you can. Think what a huge difference it can make if godly men and women across this nation are elected to local offices. There will be opportunities to positively influence our neighborhoods, communities and schools. Perhaps we can check the decaying spread of policies promoted by those with hostile anti-Christian agendas.

"Psalm 11:3 sounds an urgent warning to a people where wickedness seems to have gained the upper hand: 'If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?'

"I don't believe the foundation laid by our forefathers is destroyed just yet, but it certainly is cracked and crumbling. We shouldn't be surprised by our trials, for Psalm 11:5 tells us, 'The Lord tests the righteous.' But He promises that He will not leave us nor forsake us

(Deuteronomy 31:6). The rest of Psalm 11 assures us that God is on His throne in the heavens, He hates wickedness and violence, and He loves justice.

"For the sake of America, Christians need to pray, to vote, and to work hard in our cities and towns to be a clear voice for God's eternal truth and His redeeming love.

"I hope that God will spark a revival and awakening in our nation. My confidence and trust is completely in His mercy and grace."

Lemon Delight *Louise Morris*



Dissolve 2 packages of lemon Jell-O in 2 cups boiling water. Add: ½ cup honey, juice from ½ lemon, & 1 can drained crushed pineapple. Let set, but slightly.

Fold above mixture into one can whipped evaporated milk (let milk form crystals in freezer before whipping).

Graham Cracker Crust: melt 1/3 cup butter; add 1 ¼ cup graham cracker crumbs. Place in bottom of a baking dish (save some crumbs to

sprinkle on top).

Put Jell-o & evaporated milk mixture in crust. Sprinkle remaining crumbs on top.

Refrigerate before serving.
