“Not Hope Against Hope” Isaiah 40:21-31
Salem Presbyterian Church
February 4, 2018

Our passage is set in the time after the deportation of Judeans to Babylon in 587 BC. God had punished them for their wickedness. Now, Yahweh reverses the declaration that they are no longer His children, and God speaks in a way that presupposes that a loving relationship still exists. God is giving words of comfort through Isaiah. The Judeans’ sin has been paid for. The city’s desolation, its subjection to Babylon, and its abandonment by its God have gone on long enough. She has received from Yahweh’s hand, double for all her sins. Looking at the bigger picture, Yahweh, the covenant God, the Creator of heaven and earth, tirelessly works out His plan of salvation for His people. Their restoration is based on His loving nature. He will renew the strength of His people, but this is dependent on their willingness to submit themselves to Him.

TEACHING POINTS

First. God cares about our fallen world.

Second. God is Lord over all.

Third. If we want the comfort of God, by faith, we need to prepare for it.

THIS WEEK’S MEMORY PASSAGE

But those who trust in the LORD will find new strength. They will soar high on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not faint (Isaiah 40:31 NLT).

ACTION POINT

Isaiah is calling the Judeans to look behind their present despair and depression to their convictions about Yahweh that they surely still affirm. They are called to set their hope on the fact that the God, in whom they believe, is also sovereign in the world’s political and military events. Here the word, “*Hope*,” means “*not hope against hope*,” but it means being convinced that your expectation has reasons to have hope. Such hope means that the weary find new resources of energy and perseverance, because they know that they have an exciting future. Instead of despairing, they have a good future to look forward to fulfilling. Your situation may now seem hopeless, but remember God sometimes uses bad circumstances to teach you things that you would not have learned in prosperity. When people realize their own powerlessness, it is then that they will be open to the power that saves -- God's power.

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
