#### Pastor's Thoughts

<sup>31</sup> Here is another illustration Jesus used: "The Kingdom of Heaven is like a mustard seed planted in a field. <sup>32</sup> It is the smallest of all seeds, but it becomes the largest of garden plants; it grows into a tree, and birds come and make nests in its branches" Matthew 13:31-31 NLT.

As we begin our New Year, it is important to keep your



eye focused first on serving God and His Kingdom. Many times, we miss opportunities to do God's will in small things, because they seem so unimportant. Perhaps, smiling at someone or giving someone a needed hug or listening for a moment might make a difference in someone's day. There are other things you can do.

A friend of mine once saw that a van pulled up alongside him in a Mc Donald's drive-through with two ordering lanes. The mini van was beat up and missing hug caps. A mom was driving with four little ones in the back seats. He overheard her order attempt before he moved forward, and he watched her counting change and pennies and changing her order with the money she could pull together to pay for her order. When he drove forward and paid his tab, he said to the teenager wearing a headset, "I want to pay for the van behind me as well. Tell them that '**Jesus paid for it all**,' and give her the rest of the change for the money I paid."

He then pulled around at a distance and parked after getting his order to see what happened as he began eating in his car. She was stunned that her bill was paid. He saw that she began to cry as she pulled forward. My friend knew he made a difference in someone's day and that Christ got the glory.

### New Birth - A Living Hope

Salvation in Jesus Christ represents new birth -- a transformation of who we are. The start of a new year is a great time to reflect on the new and living hope we have in this life and in the life to come:

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. (**1 Peter 1:3**, NIV)

# Hope for the Future

We can trust God in the year ahead, for he has good plans for our future:

### Jeremiah 29:11

For I know the plans I have for you," says the LORD. "They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope. (NLT)

### A New Creation

This passage describes a transformation that will eventually lead to the full enjoyment of eternal life in the new heavens and new earth. Christ's life, death, and resurrection introduce followers of Jesus Christ to a foretaste of the new world to come. # Forget the Past - Learn from Mistakes

### **Trustee Update**

In 2017, \$7,866.50 was spent on elevator repairs and inspections. An awning was installed over the outside elevator door at a cost of \$2,812.00. Adding insulation to the church attic was \$1,900. Six ceiling fans were replaced at a material cost of \$948.01. The ServiceMaster charge was \$1,696.59 to dry out basement after flooding. \$1,024.00 was spent on repairs to the bell tower. In 2018, Elevator costs have been \$485, a new screen door was added to the north side of the church, and high efficient LED lights were placed above the sanctuary to shine on the cross. The Trustees mulched and maintained the landscape around the church in both 2017 and 2018.
