Israel was tired of listening to God through His prophets, and Israel wanted a king who will ensure their justice and security. Ancient kings were responsible for providing both benefits. There is a downside to earthly kingships. A royal administrative monarchy inevitably grows and needs to be subsidized by those whom it is supposed to protect. As it gains more and more power, this kingship can quickly become repressive. This is the picture that Samuel described for the people as he explains what the future kings will be like. Eventually, they will view their king as an oppressor, not a guardian. Too late, they will discover that having a king like other nations is not as helpful as they imagine it to be
