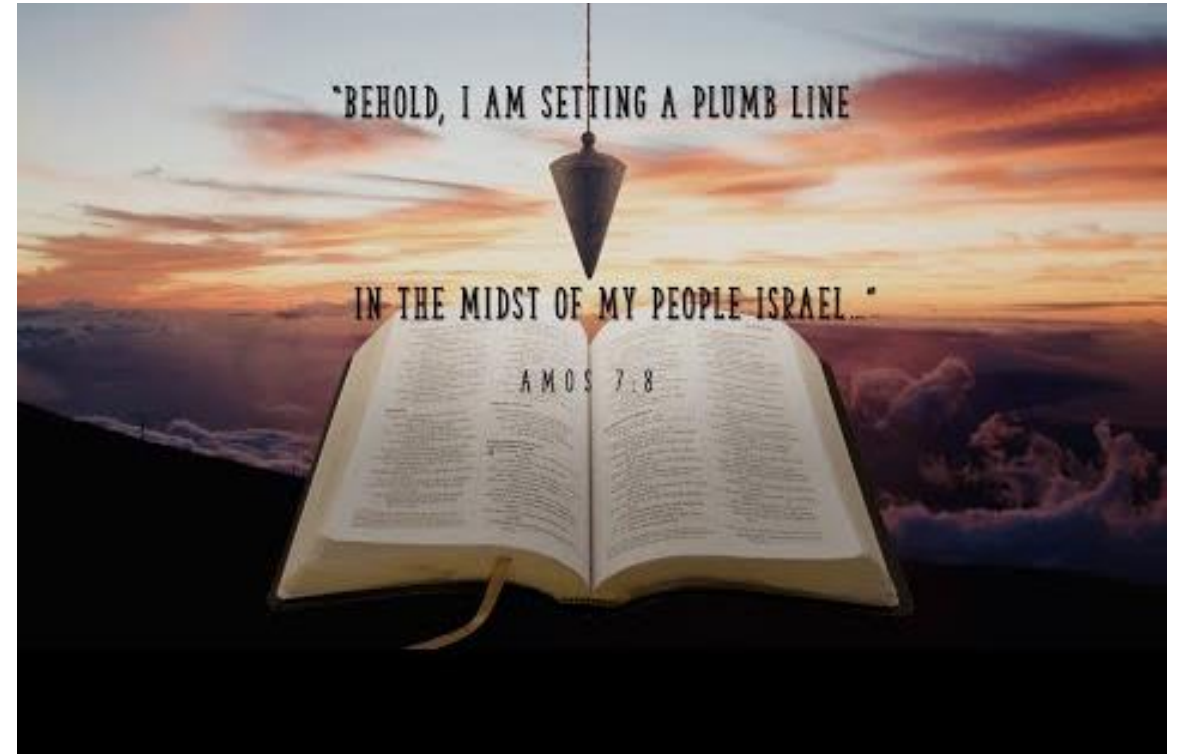

“The Plumbline God Uses” Amos 7:7-17

Jeroboam founded a “new religion” that was a rejection of the religion of Israel’s covenant past. He ruled in absolute power. In our passage, Jeroboam’s chief priest at Bethel sent a message to Jeroboam’s palace to report the coming judgment of God that Amos has been preaching against the kingdom. It is noteworthy that in his report, Amaziah does not attribute Amos’ words to Yahweh but only reports what Amos is saying. In short, Amaziah does not believe Amos’ words are divinely inspired. Amaziah believes God will not do anything in judgment, but the aroused populace may, and it is the threat that Amaziah wishes to be eliminated.

TEACHING POINTS

POINT ONE – *Society is out of plumb.* Contemporary additions to Christianity not found in the Bible make it a “new religion.”

POINT TWO – *Be the kind of person that God is seeking.*

POINT THREE – *Focus on the promise of God.*

THIS WEEK’S VERSE

⁸ *And the LORD said to me, “Amos, what do you see?” I answered, “A plumb line.” And the Lord replied, “I will test my people with this plumb line. I will no longer ignore all their sins (Amos 7:8 NLT).*

ACTION POINT

However hard we try, none of us are righteous people. But it is only as we are honest with our sinfulness that we can appreciate the enormity of God's grace that continues to love us. Our fate depends upon our understanding that God does have a Biblical standard of justice and mercy and expects us to be responsive to it. We live in a world and society that desperately needs to hear the words of the prophets. We need to listen to these words, not because they are comforting, but because they shake us out of any temptation to complacency. Why not ponder the words of 1 John 1:8-9 and realize that we all have some getting right with God: "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is just will cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Why not confess your shortcomings to God in Jesus’ Name and be forgiven?

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
