

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**Rev. Thomas Emery**  
**“A Life That Looks Good but Lacks Goodness” Amos 8:1-12**  
**Salem Presbyterian Church**  
**July 17, 2022**

Amos was one of Israel's great prophets, and he took pains to remind listeners that he was just an ordinary migrant worker. God spoke to him through a series of visions when Amos was in worship. The fourth vision given to Amos was a basket of summer fruit. It was the annual offering of the first fruits of the harvest. People would bring a fresh basket of the finest of their harvest and place it on the altar as a gift of thanksgiving to God. The offering took place as it did each year, but suddenly something stirred within Amos. For Amos, God was saying the ripe fruit suggested not thanksgiving for harvest and trust for winter rains but an "end" to the relationship with God. What looked so ripe and beautiful was on the verge of being spoiled and rotten.

**TEACHING POINTS**

**POINT ONE** – *The people have lost the sense that they are to reflect God in their lives.*

**POINT TWO** – *Having lost their identity, the people pushed the envelope of what is acceptable behavior.*

**POINT THREE** – *God will send a famine on the land; not a famine of bread, or thirst for water, but of hearing the Words of the Lord.*

**THIS WEEK’S VERSE**

<sup>2</sup> *“What do you see, Amos?” he asked. I replied, “A basket full of ripe fruit.” Then the LORD said, “Like this fruit, Israel is ripe for punishment! I will not delay their punishment again.” (Amos 8:2 NLT)*

**ACTION POINT**

Amos was fearful that God was going to reach the limits of divine patience and give up on the people. God is telling Amos that the people have gone on too long in their sins and have neared a point of no return where the nation will suffer an unwanted fate. And that is precisely what happened. Less than thirty years later, Israel fell to the Assyrians, and many of the people were dispersed to other lands. The people of Israel didn't like what they heard. They liked how they lived. They wouldn't listen. They ran Amos out of town. He went home and wrote it all down in hopes that someday, somewhere, someone would hear the Word of the Lord about the way to live with Him and with each other -- and then live it out. Jesus likewise said, *"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness, for they shall be satisfied."* Why not seek the righteousness of God found in reading His Word, and be blessed, not cursed, with judgment?

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
