Rev. Thomas Emery "Trust in the Faithfulness of God" Jeremiah 32:1-3a, 6-15 Salem Presbyterian Church September 25, 2022

Our passage takes place during an enemy attack which will lead to exile. During the attack, the prophet Jeremiah trusts that God has a future for the Hebrew people and their homeland. A seemingly irrational act in the already enemy-occupied area, Jeremiah buys the deed to a piece of property right under the enemy encampment as a statement of trust in God. Likewise, Psalm 91 is a prayer of faith in the face of dangers—confidence answered by God's reassurance. 1 Timothy chapter 2 reminds us that even in settled times when we have wealth and status, rather than war and physical threat, our comfort often lures us away from placing our faith in God. Adding to that theme, Luke tells the story of a rich man so wrapped up in his status and wealth that even in hades, he still is still trying to take charge of his life and order God around.
