PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

"Look, I am coming soon, bringing my reward with me to repay all people according to their deeds (Revelation 22:12 NLT).

Maybe you've become indifferent to the sound of Jesus knocking on your heart. Perhaps, your attention has been captured by other things like work, finances, and romantic love. Those things seem important until you realize that they are only temporary. Jesus has warned us that He is coming quickly.

When your life is over or when the Lord returns, nothing on this earth will be of any value. We all think that we have more time to get right with God, but the truth is that life is short. Tomorrow is not guaranteed. Things we do today matter on an eternal level. If Jesus came back today, would you be ready? Would you be able to say that your heart was firmly set on Christ?

Matthew 7:21-23 says, ²¹ "Not everyone who calls out to me, 'Lord! Lord!' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Only those who do the will of my Father in heaven will enter. ²² On judgment day many will say to me, 'Lord! Lord! We prophesied in your Name and cast out demons in your Name and performed many miracles in your Name.' ²³ But I will reply, 'I never knew you. Get away from me, you who break God's laws.'

It's a sobering thought that someone could prophecy in the Name of Jesus, cast out demons in the Name of Jesus, and do miraculous things in Jesus' Name yet still miss the point of this Christian walk.

Some people do all the right things. They'll say all the right words, but still their hearts will not be in the right place. You see a true relationship with Jesus it's not about following all the rules or working hard to earn His favor. Walking with Christ requires us to understand that it's all about Him. It's all about Jesus. It's all about His will. His way. It's about a deep meaningful relationship with Him.

I hope that I'm making myself clear: being a Christian is not about anything else other than Jesus Christ. Matthew 15 verse 8 Jesus says these people honor me with their lips but their hearts are far from me. In all of their spiritual words and actions, these people do not seek to glorify God. They seek to glorify themselves. Don't let that be the story of your life.

Don't be content with simply looking like a Christian on the outside. True Christianity isn't about fixing up your appearance, it's about loving the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and mind. Your eternal future hinges on that distinction.



If you profess to follow Jesus, the four words you never want to hear are: "I Never knew you." When you stand before the throne of God, will He look at you as a son or daughter or will he look at you like a stranger He's never met?

I have Good News for you as you prepare for Lent. There's still time to get to know Jesus, and there's still time to ask yourself if you are truly living for God or if you're living for the things of this world. Do you have a real relationship with Jesus Christ? Do you know Him or do you just know a lot of things about Him? Our salvation is not based on how many verses we've memorized or our church attendance or our theology, it's based on having a true relationship with God. If you've been distant from Him lately, run back to the Lord with all your heart and ask Him to renew your thinking.

Ask him to make you authentic in your love and desire for Christ. May your actions reflect the heart of someone whom Jesus has touched. To know Jesus means to follow Him not just in the good times but through hardship and suffering. If you truly love Jesus, you must be willing to endure everything He endured, because you believe He is worthy of all things. Let us all humble ourselves and pray. "Lord Jesus, please become my Lord and Savior. Fill me with Your Holy Spirit. I know now that I have sought this world with its temporary pleasures and sin. This season of Lent, help me, Jesus, to put you first in my life. Help me to only live for You. All that I have, my talents, treasures, and time, I put at Your feet. In Jesus' Name, I pray. Amen.

Why Lent?

But he was pierced for our rebellion, crushed for our sins. He was beaten so we could be whole. He was whipped so we could be healed (Isaiah 53:5 NLT).

Welcome to the annual season of Lent. Lent is a time of reflection on Christ's suffering and death on the cross for our sins. As we embark on this six-week journey, we should remember and meditate on the great sacrifice that was made on our behalf.

Invite others to gather with you at your worship service. This may be the first time they hear of the saving love of Jesus for them.

Read your Bible and retrace the sorrow, the pain and agony, the betrayal that Jesus endured.

Week One of Lent - Spiritual Preparation

In the words of Jesus, "Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? (Luke 15:4)

In Jesus' time, a shepherd's job wasn't just to ensure his sheep had grass to eat and water to drink; he also had to protect his flock. Sheep are so gentle that it's

easy for wolves to catch them. The shepherd would watch them by day and sleep beside them at night.

Spending so much time with them meant he knew each one individually. Often, out of love, the shepherd would give each sheep a name. If one went missing, it wasn't enough that he had ninety-nine others. One of his beloved creatures could be hurt, or even worse. His heart wouldn't stop hurting until he found his missing sheep.

Our Savior is our Good Shepherd. He knows each of us by name and watches over us always. If we stray from Him, He'll never stop trying to lead us back. It isn't until we return to Him that His heart stops hurting. Let's pray: Good Shepherd, thank you for choosing me for Your flock and for watching over me always. In Jesus' Name, Amen!

Week Two - Resisting Temptation

Satan's words to Jesus, " 7 I will give it all to you if you will worship me" (Luke 4:7 NLT).

On Sue's first day at her new school, she sat by herself in the lunchroom. Julia immediately came over and joined her. Although Julia was awkward and shy, she was also welcoming and kind. They sat together for the rest of the week.

During Sue's second week, the popular Emerson came up to her and said, "The girls and I have decided we like you. You can sit at our lunch table from now on, but you have to ditch Julia. There's no way she's sitting with us."

Sue was tempted by Emerson's offer, the same way Jesus was tempted by the devil in the desert. But just like Emerson said Sue had to ditch Julia, the devil said Jesus had to turn against God and worship the devil instead.

Despite being incredibly weak from 40 days without food, Jesus found the strength to resist the temptation.

Sue did the same. She and Julia have been friends ever since.

We all are met with temptation of some form or another in our daily lives. It could be so subtle as to tell a "little white lie", fudge the numbers in your tax ledger, have lustful thoughts, or wish someone harm. Jesus is well acquainted with human temptation. He experienced it all because He (being fully God), walked upon this earth being fully human. He never gave in to Satan, yet He was tempted far beyond what we will ever be. Jesus had the strength of His Father and the guidance of the Holy Spirit leading Him. We are offered the strength of our Father and guidance of the Holy Spirit to resist – to flee from temptation. We, like Jesus, need to keep our focus on what is right and call out to Him for help when we are tempted.

"The temptations in your life are no different from what others experience. And God is faithful. He will not allow the temptation to be more than you can stand. When you are tempted, He will show you a way out so that you can endure" (1 Corinthians 10:13 NLT).

Let's pray: Dear God, please protect me from all temptation by giving me the strength and courage to always do the right thing. In Jesus' Name, Amen!


