PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

And how will anyone go and tell them without being sent? That is why the Scriptures say, "How beautiful are the feet of messengers who bring good news! (Romans 10:15 NLT)"

This Lent Season, we might realize that we think too small. Suppose we could fully imagine what God can do with our lives. Let me illustrate how God works in this world.

Way back in 1858, a Sunday School teacher in Chicago named **Ezra Kimball** became interested in the spiritual welfare of a young shoe clerk in his town. The Holy Spirit was tugging at him. After debating what to do about it, Kimball started down toward Holton's shoe store where the young man worked.

After walking past the store once or twice, Kimball finally mustered up his courage and went in. Finding the young man in the stock room, Kimball proceeded to talk with the young man about his faith.

God had prepared the young man's heart for the encounter. The shoe clerk Kimball showed such interest in that day was named **Dwight L. Moody**. Kimball got through to Moody, and Moody went on to become the greatest Christian evangelist of his day.

But this is just the beginning of what God would do through that Sunday School teacher's witness. He was used by God to start a worldwide revival.

Dwight L. Moody became a popular speaker and went on to preach a crusade in England and, in 1879, awakened the heart of **Frederick B. Meyer**, a pastor, then, of a small church. Meyer went on to become a renowned theologian. Later, Meyer was preaching in Moody's school in Northfield, Massachusetts, when the young man in the back row heard Meyer say,

"If you are not willing to give up everything for Christ, are you willing to be made willing?"

Those words transformed the ministry of another young man, **J. Wilbur Chapman**. Wilbur Chapman became a

YMCA worker, back when the Y was still a religious institution.



Among those whom Chapman recruited to help him in his ministry was a former professional baseball player. That baseball player was a remarkable figure named **Billy Sunday**. Billy Sunday went on to become the greatest evangelist of his generation.

Later at a revival in Charlotte, North Carolina, Billy Sunday so excited a group of local men that they began an ongoing prayer group. Soon, they engaged an evangelist named **Mordecai Hamm** to come to their town to keep the revival spirit alive. In the revival with Mordecai Hamm, a young man heard the gospel and made his profession of faith. His name? **Billy Graham**. Bill Graham reached hundreds of millions for Christ.

What I am saying to you is this. When you follow God's leadership and you step out in faith, like that Sunday School teacher who overcame his shyness and witnessed to DL Moody, you can eventually set things in motion for Billy Grahams and millions to come to Christ.

Then, you not only play a part in God's great plan for creation, but you find the most fulfilling life for yourself as well. This Lent, consider listening to what the Holy Spirit can set in motion through your obedience to God. "If you are not willing to give up everything for Christ, are you willing to be made willing?"

Mercy, Passion, and Joy


Good Friday – "Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, 'Father, into Your hands I commend My spirit,' Having said this, He breathed His last." Luke 23:46

"God is love." "For God so loved the world that He gave." "How great is the love the Father has lavished on us." "We love because He first loved us." "Love is patient, love is kind." "Love never fails." "God has poured out His love into our hearts."

This is a dominant theme throughout Scripture, especially in the New Testament. And then we soon turn to the cross.

What an unusual picture of love for us to see the Savior stretched out on a wooden cross, suffering the agony of that death which is normally reserved for the worst of the worst. But we have to realize that He did this for us.

He died the death we deserved. He paid for the sins *He* hadn't committed, but *we* had.



"No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). Love shows itself in giving, and Jesus gave His all for us. That painful, agonizing death was death in our place. And now, as a result, we have life.

We cry out our prayer: Lord, I will praise You for all eternity for Your sacrifice, this gift of Your vast love. In Your precious Name, Amen!

"Then He took a loaf of bread, and when He had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, 'This is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' And He did the same with the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood.' Luke 22:19-20."

Easter Communion – "We may think this rather crude and unspiritual. God does not: He invented eating. He likes matter. He invented it" (*Mere Christianity, 65*).

In *The Wright of Glory*, C. S. Lewis once wrote, "There are no ordinary people." He could also have written, "There are no ordinary things." Or "no ordinary elements."

Anything that God has made is extraordinary because it has the hand of God behind it. But God went a step further in endowing the bread and wine in the Lord's Supper with special meaning and power. When Jesus took the loaf of bread and cup of wine, He blessed them. He gave them meaning far beyond their "ordinary" meaning. They are "the gifts of God for the people of God," as pastors often say.

Lewis's point is that God loves to use physical things, material things, and seemingly ordinary things.



The writer, Lewis, who loved to take walks in the countryside and enjoy the world God made is the same Lewis who saw the extraordinary in bread and wine, and he writes that God uses those material things "to put new life into us." That's power. Since it is given and poured out for us in the new covenant, that's forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation.

Let us pray: God and Creator, I praise You for the humble gifts of bread and wine, through which I receive my Lord's Body and Blood. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

St David's Day: Everything You Need to Know

David is the patron saint of Wales, and he is celebrated on the first of March. To mark the day, Welsh people around the world wear one or both of Wales's national emblems - a daffodil and a leek.

Special concerts and parades are also held in St David's honor. Patron saints are chosen to be special protectors or guardians over all areas of life. In our secular world, they are national



identities. England, Ireland, and Scotland also have their patron saint, to whom they dedicate a day.

Who was St David?

St David - or *Dewi Sant* in Welsh - was born on the southwest coast of Wales, near to where the city of St David's is today. We don't know the exact year when he was born, but it is believed to be sometime in between 462 and 515 AD.

There are many stories about miracles happening around St David as a church planter spreading the gospel. One of the famous stories is from when he was speaking to a large crowd and someone in the crowd shouted: "We won't be able to see or hear him." Then, the ground David stood on is said to have risen so that he was standing on a hill, making it easier for everyone to see him. It is said that he lived for more than 100 years and died on Tuesday, 1 March 589.

Finally, a National St David's Day parade is held in the center of Cardiff, the capital of Wales, every year, with lots of exciting performances by musical and theatrical groups. Usually, many children take part, wearing traditional Welsh clothing and performing traditional dances. Across the Wales, lots of towns and villages host their own parades and concerts, while many of the country's castles and heritage sites let people come to visit them for free.

Easter Sunday

The **Easter Sunday, March 31**st Service is a time of observance of the love of God shown by Christ dying on the Cross to pay for our sins. It is also a time of Christian community showing that we are all the same Body of Christ, with each of us given by God, unique gifts and talents to share with one another.

The schedule for the morning begins at 8:00 AM with an Easter Breakfast; all are invited. At 9:00 AM, we venture upstairs to participate in the Flowering of the Cross ceremony of prayerfully decorating the cross after thanking God for the great mercy that He has bestowed upon us by His Son dying on the Cross for our sins.

Then, at 9:30 AM, we begin Worship Service with Communion for anyone Baptized in Christ Jesus.

Afterward, it is a great time for family photographs and to welcome and to socialize with others in the love of Christ Jesus.




